Indefinite article – a/an

- * My daughter really wants a dog for Christmas.
- * Somebody call a policeman! (singular, non-particular)
- * When I was at the zoo, I saw an elephant!
- * I am a teacher. (group membership / profession)
- * I need a bottle of water. (countable)
- * She wants a water. (uncountable)
- * He earns \$200 a day. (instead of per)

A or An – spelling matters

Begin w. consonant [sound] a boy, a car, a bike, a zoo, a user	Begin w. vowel an elephant, an apple, an idiot, an umbrella
Pronounced H a horse	Silent H an hour
a TAU	an MSDS, an SOS
a broken egg	an unusual problem

Definite article – the

specific	The dog that bit me ran away.
already known	I have two cars: <i>a</i> Ford and <i>an</i> Audi. <i>The</i> Ford is white and <i>the</i> Audi is silver.
common knowledge	Last week <i>a</i> fighter plane crashed into <i>a</i> field but <i>the</i> pilot managed to eject safely.
unique	It was <i>the</i> worst day of my life! The captain was <i>the</i> first person to leave the burning tanker.

Definite article – the (2)

catogory	The computer has changed our lives.
category	The computer has changed our lives.
musical instruments	Richard Clayderman plays the piano.
currencies	The U.S. dollar has risen against the yen but fallen against the euro.

entertainment / medium In *the* daytime I listen to *the* radio, but in *the* evenings I like to watch television.

Geo usage of the – don't

names of most countries/territories

Italy, Mexico, Bolivia

but *the* Netherlands, *the* Dominican Republic, *the* Philippines, *the* United States

names of cities, towns, or states

Seoul, Manitoba, Miami

names of streets

Washington Blvd., Main St.

names of lakes and bays Lake Titicaca, Lake Erie

except with a group of lakes like the Great Lakes

Geo usage of the – don't (2)

names of mountains

Mount Everest, Mount Fuji

except with ranges of mountains like *the* Andes or *the* Rockies or unusual names like *the* Matterhorn

names of continents

Asia, Europe

names of islands

Easter Island, Maui, Key West

except with island chains like *the* Aleutians, *the* Hebrides, or *the* Canary Islands

Geo usage of the – do

names of rivers, oceans and seas

the Nile, the Pacific

points on the globe

the Equator, the North Pole

geographical areas

the Middle East, the West

deserts, forests, gulfs, and peninsulas

the Sahara, the Persian Gulf, the Black Forest, the Iberian Peninsula

Count and noncount nouns

- * *The* can be used with noncount nouns:
 - * "I love to sail over *the* water" (some specific body of water) or "I love to sail over water" (any water).
 - * "He spilled *the* milk all over the floor" (some specific milk) or "He spilled milk all over the floor" (any milk).
- * A/an can be used only with count nouns
 - * I need a bottle of water.
 - * I need a new glass of milk.

Article omission

names of languages and	Chinese, English, Spanish, Russian
nationalities	but " <i>The</i> Spanish are known for their warm hospitality."
names of games/sports	volleyball, hockey, baseball
names of academic subjects	mathematics, biology, history, computer science
headlines	Iraqi Head Seeks Arms Stolen Painting Found by Tree
abstract nouns	Love is all you need.
